### TO CONTRIBUTORS

*The British Journal of Experimental Biology* will publish original contributions in genetics, experimental embryology, comparative physiology, and histological, cytological, or morphological subjects having a direct bearing on problems of experimental interest.

All communications should be addressed to the Managing Editor, at the ANIMAL BREEDING RESEARCH DEPARTMENT, THE UNIVERSITY, EDINBURGH.

Contributions should be sent in double-spaced typescript on one side only of the paper.

In view of the present cost of printing and the intention of the Editors to publish regular reviews of recent progress in different fields of research, authors are requested to minimise space devoted to historical introductions and theoretical discussions.

Except in certain circumstances it is not intended to publish any illustrations other than diagrams and actual photographs reproduced in line or by the half-tone process.

Bibliography should be given under the heading "References" in the following form: Surname of author (in alphabetical order), date of publication, title of journal, volume of journal in arabic figures, and, if desired, page of reference. When the title of the paper itself is included it should follow immediately the date of publication.

Every paper must be accompanied by an abstract not exceeding 500 words in length, and must contain a summary of the chief results of the enquiry.

Authors who wish to expedite publication are requested to limit their communications to about 6000 words.

The date on which the MSS. is received by the Editor will appear with each paper.

Authors will receive fifty gratis reprints with additional copies at reduced rates.
